There seemed to be something more to this Bookstore, and to the Spectacular Spectacles that Sam procured to help with Theodore's strained eyesight. Things were coming alive—the Bookstore, the stories. Suddenly Theodore could see everything so clearly.

The Main Characters


Theodore: (Theo for short) – Described at first as a "bumbling breadbox with fur", Theo is the central hero of the stories. A Welsh Corgi, small of stature but big of heart, he is both vulnerable and fearless and a smart little dog. He make friends easily and doesn't panic when he is thrust into new circumstances even when they are threatening. He wears magical glasses and, he can talk! Everyone loves Theo except for the mean characters he thwarts.


Sam: The kind bookstore owner who saves Theo from the dog pound. Sam is gentle, thoughtful and a bit disheveled and disorganized. He has no idea that his bookstore is magical until Theo arrives. He loves kids and dogs and his little bookstore. He gets a little nervous being sucked into books but he, like Theo, uses his wits and knowledge of the books to help get them out of sticky situations. He is tall and lanky and wears glasses like Theo (but not magical ones) and is about 40.

Abbott: A short, portly little man who dresses oddly, with a bowler hat and topcoat, and first appears only to Theo to deliver glasses that turn out to be magical. He is the caretaker of the magic in the bookstore and lives in the closet-sort of. We learn more about him in book three and his connection to all the magic. He appears to be about 50 but could be a thousand years old.

Robin Hound: A slow talking, slow thinking and rather slow moving hound dog who likes to think of himself as something more than he is- including being the best friend of Robin Hood. He is a bit cowardly and inept but well meaning if a little bit self-serving. His ears are as big as his body and his nose is as true as any hound. At times, he finds his courage and helps Theo and Sam escape from some harrowing situations. In his own way, he is a lovable character.

Nan: A little girl, about 11, who first suggests Theo needs glasses when she observes him crashing into everything in the bookstore. A wearer of some of the biggest glasses ever-at least on her small, thin face-she immediately surmises that maybe Theodore is just far-sighted and needs glasses for reading, or rather for seeing things before he crashes into them. It is Nan who suggests Theo join the bookstore's reading class and convinces Sam to order Theo's glasses.

Many, Many other characters from the classics: Tinker Bell, Robin Hood, Peter Pan, Captain Hook, the Velvet Rabbit and every character from any book Theo will jump into in the future!

Characters in the Magical Bookstore: Dragons, Unicorns, fairies, monkeys, and magical creatures of every sort abound!


Tale of the Spectacular Spectacles


His magical new home – Theo and Sam get whisked into The Adventures of Robin Hood.



The Adventures of Robin Hound Book 2



The Mysterious Abbott and the Velveeta Rabbit Book 3










The Abbott appears to Sam, Theo, and Hound!

The adventures of the highly acclaimed "Theodore and the Enchanted Bookstore" series continue!


